
Dear friends,

COMPLETED PROJECTS



ORFANATO NIÑOS DE CRISTO

La Romana, Dominican Republic

Maestro Cares Foundation's first project was launched in La Romana, Dominican Republic. The dire need of assistance displayed by the youth in this area motivated the creation of Maestro Cares Foundation. In association with Orfanato Niños de Cristo, the orphanage opened on April 2, 2014 and now accommodates up to 50 orphaned, abandoned or abused boys whose ages range from 10 months to 18 years old. The campus includes dormitories, classrooms, a health clinic, a dining hall and recreational facilities. One of Maestro Cares Foundation's first supporters was GOYA Foods, who sponsored the children's baseball field.

INTERNADO MONSEÑOR VÍCTOR TAMAYO

Barranquilla, Colombia

Unfortunately, almost half of Colombians live below the poverty line. The most vulnerable among them are the children whom are often abused or abandoned. In 2014, Maestro Cares Foundation and its partners, Fundación Pacific and Fundación Tecnoglass, joined forces with the support of city officials to build an orphanage and school in Barranquilla. On April 11, 2015, Internado Monseñor Víctor Tamayo opened its doors with the capacity to serve up to 200 children! The campus provides a variety of services, including quality education through on-site classrooms, healthcare at the clinic and wellness via the recreational facilities. GOYA Foods continued its support by sponsoring a soccer field for this site.

PROJECT MABA

Lima, Perú

Project MABA is an innovative educational program that uses state of the art technology to deliver high-quality programming to disadvantaged children in Lima, Peru. In 2016, Maestro Cares Foundation sponsored the No. 25 Fe and Alegría School in partnership with the Hochschild Foundation, TecSup and Universidad de Ingeniería y Tecnología (UTEC). Due to Maestro Cares Foundation's support, 376 children have benefitted, more than 50 tablets have been delivered, 13 teachers have been trained and 12 classrooms have been impacted. This project provides a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) curriculum for grades 1-3, bridging the educational gap in developing countries. This program continues to date and is sponsored by the Department of Education.

CASA HOGAR ALEGRÍA CACALOMACÁN

Toluca, México

In 2015, Maestro Cares Foundation partnered with Casa Hogar Alegría and Fundación Telmex Telcel in Cacalomacán, Toluca to build a home for orphaned girls. This site provides positive encouragement and resources to transform the lives of girls who are neglected, abandoned or abused. The campus opened on April 11, 2015 and has the capacity to house up to 70 girls in its four dormitories. The buildings include laundry facilities, a kitchen, chapel, library, dining room, studying room, computer lab and multi-purpose rooms. In addition, GOYA Foods donated a recreational sports complex and Familia Mena donated the land.

HOGAR SAN MIGUEL

Ponce, Puerto Rico

In September 2015, the foundation partnered with VIDAS Sistema de Salud Episcopal San Lucas, MB Holdings, Iglesia Episcopales Puertorriquena, Municipio Autonomo Ponce and Comité Pro-Fondos Construcción Hogar Alberque San Miguel – and began construction on its fifth project, Hogar San Miguel. In Puerto Rico, hundreds of children suffer from various illnesses and learning disabilities. For some, the situation is especially dire having been removed from their homes. This facility has the capacity to serve up to 20 boys with special needs and includes a library, therapy rooms, offices, living room, dining area and recreational spaces as well as a beautiful kitchen donated by our long-time supporter, GOYA Foods.

CENTRO DE DESARROLLO INTEGRAL ALDEAS INFANTILES SOS GUATEMALA

San Juan Sacatepéquez, Guatemala

In association with Aldeas Infantiles SOS Guatemala, Maestro Cares Foundation constructed a community center, which serves the children and families of San Juan Sacatepéquez. Opened in April 2018, the community center will serve 50 at-risk kids (0-12 years of age) and 40 families. Services include nutritional and health support such as vaccinations. Grade school children have access to a technology center, sponsored by Fundacion Tigo, and educational support. Parents can also enroll in programs geared towards violence prevention and self-esteem development.

CENTRO DE DESARROLLO FAMILIAR ALDEAS INFANTILES SOS COLOMBIA

Cali, Colombia

In association with Aldeas Infantiles SOS Colombia, the Centro de Desarrollo Familiar opened in February 2019. This community center offers participants, families and SOS community with guidance through trainings, activities and empowerment programs. The programs' primary purpose is to prevent children from being separated from their families. Aside from the construction of the community center, Maestro Cares Foundation also repaired the 17 roofs to all current Aldeas homes and built a kitchen to serve meals to the local community.

ALDEAS INFANTILES SOS BOLIVIA

El Alto, Bolivia

In partnership with Marta Bedoya de Claire Foundation, this project entails the construction of two transitional homes that will serve foster children with health and other needs in the high-risk area of Aldeas Infantiles SOS Bolivia in El Alto, Bolivia. At a time, each home provides 8 children with a nurturing and caring environment and medical treatment by highly-qualified professionals. After the completion of their treatment, the children are placed into the Aldeas Infantiles SOS foster homes for long-term care. The site opened in June of 2018.

CASA HOGAR ALEGRÍA GUADALAJARA

Guadalajara, México

Maestro Cares Foundation, Fundación Telmex Telcel and Casa Hogar Alegría partnered once again for another girl's home in Mexico. This second project, located in Guadalajara, houses 64 girls in the first stage and 128 girls in the second stage, ages 6 to 21. The complex is modeled after the first Casa Hogar Alegría home in Toluca, Mexico. The new campus includes dormitories, a kitchen, chapel, dining rooms, multi-purpose and computer rooms as well as recreational spaces.

CASA HOVDE: MARTA BEDOYA DE CLAURE - FUNDACIÓN ALALAY


La Paz, Bolivia

Maestro Cares Foundation partnered with Marta Bedoya de Claire Foundation and Hovde Foundation to construct Casa Hovde: Marta Bedoya de Claire in association with Fundación Alalay. It houses 30 young girls who were living in the street and who have suffered from street violence. The girls are provided with a safe environment, a stable home, nutrition, education, mental health therapy and legal support. The home opened in February 2019.



It is with great appreciation that we spotlight our partner Fundación Telmex Telcel for our yearly partner profile.



